

DEPARTMENT 17 FLORAL EXHIBITS

- 1. Only one entry in each class division is permissible per person per class. Only one (1) premium will be paid to exhibitor in each class.**
- 2. The use or displaying of artificial flowers is prohibited and no premium will be paid.**
- 3. Plants positively will not be accepted for exhibition unless they have been growing in containers for 2 months.**
- 4. The management will not undertake to return exhibits nor be responsible for the return of exhibits. Baskets or containers must be supplied by exhibitors and will be given every possible care, but the management assumes no responsibility for their safety.**
- 5. Flowers or plants entered for competition must be more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.**
- 6. The management may at any time order the removal of any exhibit which is in bad condition. Any article manifestly unfit to show may be excluded.**
- 7. All entries must be grown by exhibitor except in arrangement classes.**
- 8. No exhibit may be removed at any time before the close of the exhibition except by consent of management.**
- 9. During judging no one but the judges and such officials as may be necessary will be permitted in the judging area. Anyone violating this rule will forfeit all premiums they may have earned.**
- 10. The judge may withhold awards where he feels the entry is not worthy.**
- 11. The judge's decision will be final.**

Division A - HOUSE PLANTS

The class includes all plants that would qualify as a house plant. Only 1 species per pot except in collection class. Pots not to exceed 12" in width and plants must be growing in said containers 2 months prior to fair.
